

Navajo Election Administration

Qualifications for White Rock Council Candidates

(White Rock Chapter)

Government of White Rock Chapter Ordinance (WRC-011-087/December 20, 2011)

1. Shall be a registered voter of the White Rock Chapter and shall be on the census roll of the Navajo Nation.
2. Shall be at least twenty-one (21) years of age at the time of election,
3. Shall be fluent in Navajo and English and read and write English.
4. Shall have knowledge and understanding of the Navajo Nation governmental affairs.
5. Shall not have been removed from a Chapter of Local Government Office within five (5) years preceding the date of filing for candidacy.
6. If a candidate for the Office of Secretary/Treasurer, knowledge of accounting or finance experience.
7. Shall not allow employment with Navajo Nation, State, or Federal government or private entity to unduly interfere with his/her performances as White Rock Council Officer.
8. Shall not have been convicted of a felony in any courts within the last five (5) years prior to the date of filing for candidacy.
9. Shall not have been convicted within the last five (5) years from the date of filing for candidacy of any misdemeanor in any courts involving:
 - a. crimes of deceit, untruthfulness and dishonesty including but not limited to extortion, embezzlement, bribery, perjury, forgery, fraud, misrepresentation, false pretense, theft, conversion, or misuse of Navajo Nation funds and property;
 - b. crimes involving the welfare of children, including child abuse and/or neglect; and
 - c. aggravated assault and aggravated battery.
10. Shall not have been found in violation of the Navajo Ethics in Government Law or the Election Code by a Navajo Nation court or the Ethics and Rules Committee of the Navajo Nation Council.
11. Shall not serve in any other Navajo Nation elective office and the office of School Board
12. Shall not be employed by the White Rock local government and local government support centers
13. Shall not allow employment with Navajo Nation, State, or Federal government or private entity to unduly interfere with his/her performance as a White Rock Council Officer
14. Shall maintain his/her qualifications for the duration of his/her term
15. Shall adhere to the White Rock local government Code of Conduct
16. Shall not be certified as qualified for any public office of the Navajo Nation if he or she has not completely satisfied or otherwise has failed to fully comply with any order of any entity, including administrative hearing bodies and courts of the Navajo Nation, authorized to impose sanctions or penalties for violations of the Navajo Nation Ethics in Government Law.
